

Landlord-Tenant Lease Renewals Legislation: Council Bill 21-0031

Current Status: Awaiting Mayor's Signature
Council Meeting June 8, 2021

Transparency in Procurement Legislation: Council Bill 21-0069

Current Status: In Committee

This bill is designed to create transparency in the procurement process by requiring contractors to submit demographic information about its business, employees, boards, and subcontractors. All information is to be publicly reported and reviewed by the council.

Baltimore City Proposed Budget: Council Bill 21-0080

Current Status: Enacted

The council passed the fiscal year 2021-2022 budget. During the process, Councilman Glover fought tirelessly to secure funding for community-based organizations, each of the communities in the 13th district, dollars for recreation and youth activities, equity in city hiring, and an east side transfer station to help create more efficient trash pick-up in east Baltimore.
